Building Congregational Vitality

According to Presbytery Mission,

"Congregational vitality is evident in a worshiping community when its structural systems, finances and discipleship practices are aligned in such a way that the community is actively engaged in the mission of God in their local community and the world, and they are powerfully focused on growing as disciples in the way of Jesus Christ."

As the flight attendants tell us, "You need to put your oxygen mask on first before you can assist others." For the past three years our focus has been on survival and the more practical aspects of congregational vitality but as we enter a new chapter, we can begin to do the work of building New Hope's "*spiritual strength and its capacity for purposeful mission.*" PC (USA) has seven marks of a vital congregation:



- Lifelong discipleship formation: First there is personal transformation, as people seek wisdom and follow Christ. About half of our survey respondents want more emphasis on Christian education for adults Second is social transformation, as people go into their community and grapple with issues such as inequality, oppression, and injustice. Matthew 25 https://www.presbyterianmission.org/ministries/matthew-25/
- **Intentional authentic evangelism:** Presbyterians are often uncomfortable with the 'e' word evangelism. Authentic evangelism occurs when we show we are Christians by our love and by our actions. We share the good news because it is part of who we are, and it flows from us to others. Thirteen of 32 people who completed our survey said that we need more emphasis on sharing the good news of the Gospel with the unchurched.
- **Outward incarnational focus:** Now is the time for New Hope to turn outward and be the hands and feet of Jesus Christ for people in our community who are suffering, marginalized, or in need.
- **Empower servant leadership:** We can help every member to discover their gifts for ministry and service and provide the training leaders need for committee and task assignments.
- **Spirit-inspired worship:** Worship is not meant to be entertainment; it is for and about God. Worship should be thought provoking and prepare us to go out in the world and do good work.
- **Caring relationships:** Welcome and show hospitality to *all*. Develop healthy ways to deal with conflict and seek reconciliation within our congregation and community.
- **Ecclesial health** refers to clarity in mission, keeping core values in ministry, fiscally responsible stewardship, developing a sustainable budget, and other aspects of well-being. It also refers to asking fundamental questions about "why" and "how" we are a congregation and a part of the larger church.
