#### MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR by Cindy Mood

It can be challenging to see God's presence in our lives amidst our hustle and bustle. We live fast-paced lives with devices pinging constantly, schedules overflowing. But God is not just a figure from an old story, God continues to move, guide, and work within our community and our individual journeys.

The last Sunday of January, we read from the book of Nehemiah. We remembered how people asked Ezra to share God's Word with them. We saw them stand up as Ezra opened the scroll; they lifted their hands, said "Amen," and bowed their heads to worship. The words read moved people to tears.

When was the last time you cried reading the Bible? When was the last time you shouted with joy hearing Scripture proclaimed? When was the last time you humbled yourself listening to the Word of God? - The people with Ezra knew that God was still moving and working through them. They trusted that the Lord would lead their way amidst uncertainty. Do you trust your God to guide you?

This month, I encourage you to not only pick up your Bible but open it. Scripture can serve as our spiritual compass, offering not just ancient wisdom but a living, breathing connection to God's heart. When we open the Bible, we are not simply reading historical accounts or religious texts—we are entering a conversation with our Creator. Through these sacred words, we find ourselves reflected in the stories of faith, doubt, struggle, and triumph that mirror our own experiences.

But scripture does more than guide—it connects. When we study the Bible together as a community, we create bonds strengthened by shared understanding and mutual growth. Our Wednesday Bible study group recently reflected on how different perspectives on a single passage can deepen everyone's understanding, showing us new facets of God's truth we might have missed on our own. We discover not just the text, but each other's hearts, struggles, and joys as we share our insights and experiences.

A colleague of mine recently returned from the communist country of Laos. The country does everything in its power to restrict gatherings (especially unsanctioned religious ones) and punishes those who try to form connections, particularly those forming Christian ties. Upon return, my colleague told the following story:

In a small village, a group of people met in a man's home for worship every week. They were able to stay under the radar until their growth was apparent to authorities. The police began invading the man's home during worship and even when no one was home. Often, police would break items or steal them. It was tiring, so one day when the police began banging on the door, the man said, "What?! - Are you here to share tea?" The police paused and said they could take a minute for tea before they searched the house. Together, the man and his family sat at table with the invading police. After a while, the man's wife brought out food. Then, the police stood up and said, "just stop doing that church business," and they left. The next day, the police again began their pounding at the door and when the man opened the door, the police asked if he had any more tea. They sat down together again. This happened for a while; eventually the police began to show up for worship – not to destroy the connections but to participate in the congregation's life.

Use technology to stay connected. Bible apps offer audio versions perfect for listening during your commute. Many apps also have features for sharing verses and discussions with friends and family.


Explore different translations together. Sometimes reading familiar passages in a new translation can spark meaningful conversations and deeper understanding.

A check was sent to Presbytery from the Special Account for the Joy Offering we collected. This amount was \$445.00.


