MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR by Cindy Mood

New Friends at New Hope,

I'm excited to be joining you as your interim pastor! As I sit down to write this first note for the newsletter, I'm already feeling blessed by the warm welcome my family and I have received from everyone we've met; I look forward to getting to know each of you personally. My family has been touched by the genuine spirit of fellowship we've witnessed in our short time here.

A quick introduction: I'm a lifelong Presbyterian and granddaughter of a Presbyterian minister who showed me what it means to love like Jesus. I was the only child my age in my childhood church, but even at my young age, I was intent on finding a church home. In middle school, I attended a Missouri-Synod Lutheran Church, taking their confirmation classes. In high school, I attended a Mennonite Church, attending winter youth camps. I served on Youth Presbytery Committees and attended Synod and General Assembly as a Youth Advisory Delegate. I experienced a church merger and, in college, grieved as my home congregation withdrew from the PCUSA, becoming ECO.

All the while, my parents did foster care, welcoming over 60 children over 17 years. No matter who entered my house, I was expected to treat them as a child of God. Beneath the hardship and heartache entering my home, we built a foundation of belonging and love. Each of my many siblings and experiences taught me something valuable about God's faithfulness.

As your interim pastor, my role is unique. While we journey together, I will:

- Resource and nurture all the good things happening at New Hope
- Help us process the departure of previous pastors and prepare for your next called pastor
- Work with the Session to assess our church's current needs and opportunities
- Ensure that worship, pastoral care, and day-to-day church life continues smoothly

Walk with you as we pray and discern where God is leading New Hope

I believe that interim periods, while sometimes challenging, can be times of extraordinary growth and renewal for a congregation. They provide an opportunity to reflect on our church's identity, strengthen our foundations, and envision new possibilities for ministry.
