P.S. RESURRECTION ROLLS RECIPE

On Easter Sunday, I shared the story of how our family made "Resurrection Rolls," aka "Empty Tomb Rolls" for the first time. Zippy and Lurena enjoyed talking about Jesus' life and marveled that "marshmallow Jesus" disappeared after baking. Because these rolls are delicious and easy, I wanted to share the recipe with you here.

Please note that I did not create this recipe and the internet has a gazillion variations.

INGREDIENTS

- ☐ 12 Rhodes Rolls, thawed*
- ☐ 12 large marshmallows
- ☐ 4 Tbsp (57 g) butter, *melted*
- ☐ ¼ cup (50 g) granulated sugar
- ☐ 1 Tbsp ground cinnamon

EQUIPMENT

Muffin Pan or 9x13 Casserole Dish Rolling Pin

INSTRUCTIONS

*THAW Rhodes rolls on a lightly greased baking sheet covered with sprayed plastic wrap for 1-2 hours at room temperature, or overnight in the refrigerator. Just long enough for the rolls to thaw and be pliable, but not completely risen.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Grease your chosen baking dish with cooking spray. Set aside.

Melt butter in a bowl in the microwave. Mix the cinnamon and sugar in a separate bowl.

Use a rolling pin to flatten a thawed roll into a circle.

Roll a large marshmallow in melted butter, then cinnamon sugar, and place it in the center of the flattened dough.

Lift the edges of the dough around the marshmallow and pinch the seams together well. Dip the top of the roll in the melted butter and then the cinnamon sugar. Place the roll seam-side down into the prepared muffin/ cupcake pan.

Repeat with each dinner roll. Let rolls rest for 15 minutes.

Bake rolls at 350°F for 15 minutes or until golden. Immediately invert rolls onto a platter. Eat while warm. (TIP: Soak pan ASAP for easy cleaning, especially if marshmallow oozed out.)





On June 8, 2025, our **Pentecost Offering** will be collected to support at-risk children, youth, and young adults






BUILDING CONGREGATIONAL VITALITY


We have been working with Leadconnects to help New Hope enter into intentional discernment through prayer, scripture and listening to the Holy Spirit. A recent article in the Presbytery newsletter, explained, "Just as in life, we can become stuck in our congregational journey of faith. Stuck in the cherished past, stuck in a mindset of scarcity of financial resources and/or labor, and even stuck in fear of the unknown future." We are working with LEADConnect to get "unstuck" and develop a strategic plan for the future.



Phase One of the Strategic Planning process is listening—first by turning inward and then outward. During the past year, we listened to members of our congregation with a survey, reflection, listening lunch, and focus groups. Your input has been invaluable for helping us understand your hopes and concerns about New Hope's future. Now it's time to turn outward and listen to our neighbors.



We will learn about a wide range of needs and ideas—far more than our little church can address. After we complete the listening process in August, we can begin to focus on how New Hope fits into the community and set priorities. It is an essential part of the Mission Study process and will help us discern the best way for us to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the community



We plan to form Listening Teams of two people who will meet with neighborhood leaders at churches, mission partners, schools, fire and police departments, and others to learn about their organizations and work in the community.

One person on the team will function as a facilitator and ask several questions while the other person will take notes. The purpose of the visit is to listen and learn—not 'sell' New Hope or get new members. We have a process for preparing, conducting the interview, a list of questions to ask, and a process for submitting your notes to the Congregational Vitality committee.
